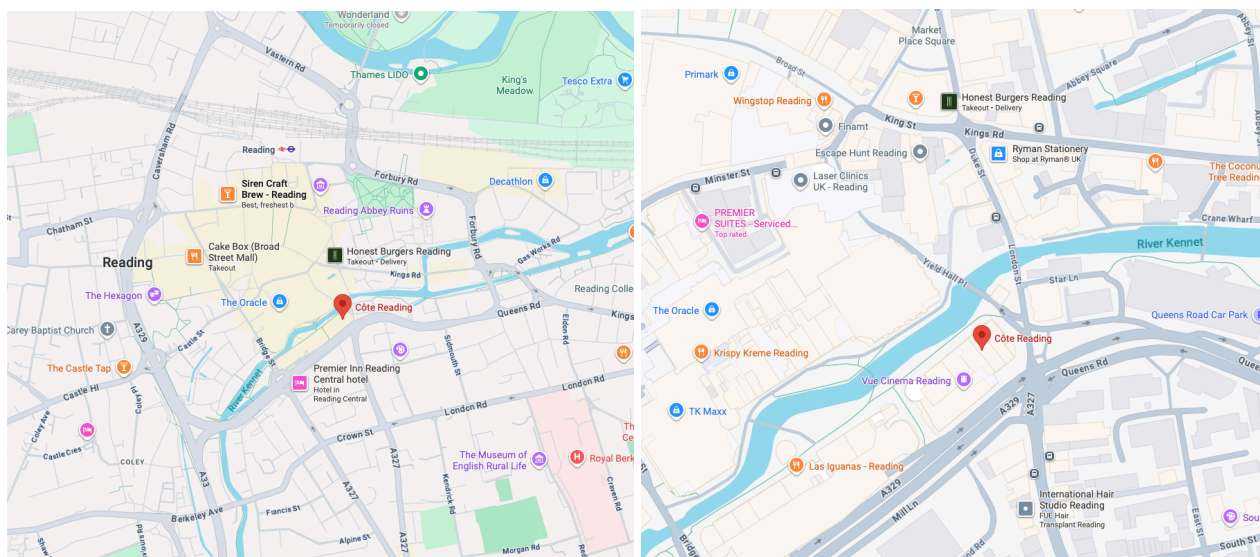
Wednesday: Joint dinner SSG/WGORC at Côte Brasserie

TRAVEL INFORMATION – TRANSPORT GENERAL INFORMATION

From the airport to ECMWF

If you are arriving at Heathrow airport, you can take a Rail Air Link bus to Reading train station. Buses depart every half hour and the journey time is about 60 minutes. You can buy tickets online or at the ticket office at the station. You can then take a bus or taxi to ECMWF.

If you are arriving at Gatwick airport, take a train to Reading train station. Fast trains depart once an hour and the journey time is about 75 minutes.

By train from London

Take a train from Paddington station to Reading station. The journey time is about 30 minutes. [Check timetable](#).

If you are arriving by Eurostar (St. Pancras International Station), take the Underground (Circle line or Hammersmith & City line) to Paddington station and proceed as above.

Alternatively, take the Underground (Victoria line to Oxford Circus, then the Bakerloo line) to Waterloo station, or you can also take bus number 59 to Waterloo station. From Waterloo station take a local train to Reading station via Wokingham. [Check timetable](#). Trains depart every half hour and the journey time is about 75 minutes.

Book a taxi

If you are visiting ECMWF and are planning to use a taxi from the airports to either ECMWF or your hotel, it is advisable to pre-book a taxi via our Reception desk, as black cabs will charge a far higher rate.

Pre-booked fares

Fares shown below are for 06:00 to 23:00; fares from 23:00 to 06:00 are 50% higher.

Airport car parking fees vary depending on how long the taxi has to wait for you on arrival,

but are likely to be approximately £12.

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Heathrow all terminals to hotels in town centre	£55.00 plus car parking fee
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Gatwick/Luton to ECMWF	£90.00 plus car parking fee (Gatwick parking ; Luton parking)
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Gatwick/Luton to hotels in town centre	£95.00 plus car parking fee (Gatwick parking ; Luton parking)
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Reading station/hotels in town centre to ECMWF	£15
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Payments are made directly to the taxi driver (cash or credit card).

Public transportation in Reading

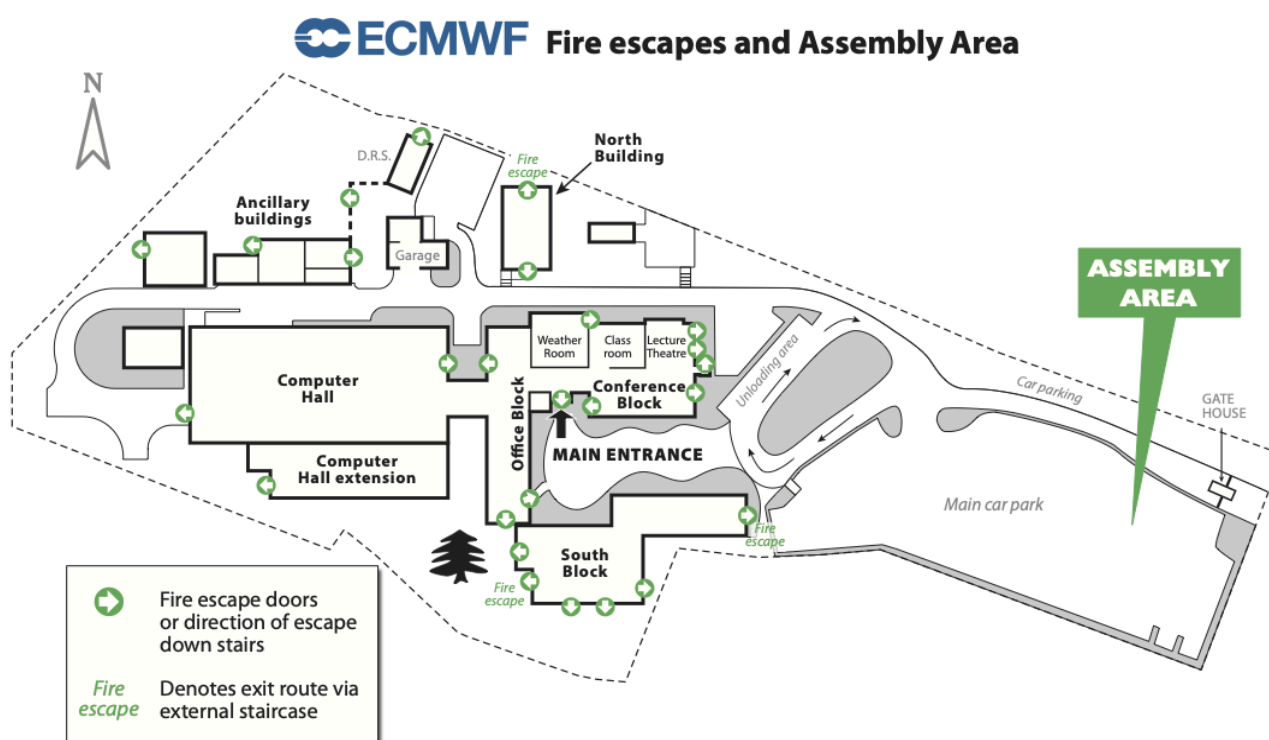
Reading Buses run bus number 3 between Reading station and Wokingham, via Shinfield Road (stop at 'Shinfield Park, Weather Centre'). [Check timetables](#).

Tickets can be bought on the bus. The driver can accept cash or contactless card payments. When buying a ticket on the bus you need to have the exact money, as the driver cannot give change.

ABOUT READING

Reading

Known for its beer, biscuits and bulbs in the industrial revolution, Reading has transformed into a vibrant, metropolitan town located on the River Thames and Kennet & Avon Canal. Home to the UK's iconic [Reading Festival](#), its growing [arts and culture](#) community boasts some of the best entertainment in the country. Reading's rich and diverse communities are represented by its global [food and drink](#) scene, with well-known chains and quirky independents serving everything from street food to fine dining. And, with three shopping centres and a pedestrianised highstreet jam-packed with household brands and independent retailers, you'll find [shopping in Reading](#) rivals some of the bigger cities in the South East. Climate

Weather in Reading is generally mild, benefitting from the Southern-UK climate. The hottest month, on average, is July with highs reaching the low-mid 20s. However, Reading tends to stay warm and comfortable across the summer months, from mid-June to early September, making it a good time of year to visit Reading for outdoor or warm-weather activities. The winter season tends to last around four months between November and March, with February being the coldest month on average. Winter temperatures usually stay within the range of 2-8 degrees.

Like with most parts of the UK, rain tends to fall throughout the year in Reading and can be a little difficult to judge - although October averages the most rainfall. Reading has the most sunshine during the summer season between May-September, with 21 June being the longest day of the year.

The legal currency in the UK is the pound (£).

Electricity

The mains supply in the UK is an alternating current (ac) voltage at a frequency of 50 hertz (Hz) and a voltage of 230 volts (V). Plug type: G.
